Key Qualifications

Dr. Cutler has consulted with the private sector, governments, NGOs, and international institutions. He has been in the op-ed pages of major U.S. and international newspapers and is regularly solicited for interviews by media organizations including Voice of America, Radio Liberty, Radio Canada International, Radio Moscow, and Radio Nederland. He has produced briefings and analyses under consultancies with the EastWest Institute, Centre for European Policy Studies, analytical bulletin *FSU [Former Soviet Union] Oil and Gas Monitor*, as well as confidential work in the private sector. He maintains a constant online presence through frequent contributions to *Central Asia–Caucasus Analyst*, *ISN Security Watch*, *Asia Times Online*, and other expert commentary sites.

His innovative concept Cooperative Energy Security was published in *Global Governance*, the official (double-blind peer-reviewed) journal of the Academic Council on the United Nations System. This concept, bringing the international environmental and energy agendas together, serves to integrate public, private, and civil-society stake-holders into transnational and transgovernmental coalitions that, in turn, sustain local participation in implementing sustainable energy development.

Dr. Cutler has published dozens of refereed articles and book chapters, a long list of policy briefings, working papers, and many more dozens of analytical commentaries for Internet sites and private clients. He has given invited testimony to Canada's House of Commons and speeches to various international conferences. He is noted for his ability to recognize significant developments in international economics and politics before they become generally evident.
